

A Kaiser repro stand is used with a Betterlight Tri-linear scanning back and Buhl lights for color accuracy. A large-format system such as BetterLight provides color accuracy and excellent resolution.

Betterlight's new ColorSage system compensates non-unifrom lighting.

The lights are placed at both sides of the art work for even lighting. Generally they are placed 45 degrees to each side.



3D objects can be scanned, this is one of the advantages of the Cruse reprographic giclee scanner.



As you can see the size of the Cruse scanner is big enough for large pieces of work. But, you can scan paintings two or three times as large as the flatbed portion and easily stitch them in Adobe Photoshop later.

If you have chromes or negatives to scan, one of the few companies in the world to still make professional level flatbed scanners is Kodak. They took over the production of CreoScitex EverSmart scanners. FLAAR has one EverSmart Supreme and one iQsmart. We recommend the EverSmart Supreme and iQsmart if you want superior quality for professional reproduction.

In the following images you can see the transparency unit of the scanner, that allows film negatives, chromes and slides to be scanned.


